Support is out there...

24-Hour Hotline

VOICe ensures survivors have immediate access to services by providing caring, trained counselor/advocates 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Crisis Counseling

VOICe also offers short-term, trauma-informed counseling in individual and group settings. Counselor/advocates provide options, support, and crisis counseling while helping survivors:

- Process and understand trauma
- Identify goals
- Safety plan

Emergency Shelter

Shelter is a temporary housing option for survivors and their minor children who must flee their homes due to domestic violence. Shelter provides an environment that is safe, secure, and supportive. While in shelter, survivors work one-on-one with counselor/advocates to make individual safety and goal plans as well as receive group and individual counseling.

Housing Programs

VOICe maintains two housing programs dedicated to helping survivors obtain safe, self-sufficient lifestyles. Program participants receive services focused specifically on the individual and unique needs of each survivor

Systems Advocacy

Once identified, survivors' goals are not always easy to obtain. VOICe can advocate on survivors' behalf in other systems. We are here to be survivors' support, and we are dedicated to the unique needs of survivors.

Legal Advocacy

Advocates aide survivors through the often confusing and complex legal system by:

- Explaining civil and criminal legal procedures
- Providing emotional support
- Protecting victims' rights
- Exploring available options

Medical Advocacy

VOICe collaborates with the medical community in order to provide information and accompaniment for victims of crime during police interviews, medical procedures, and evidence collection.

Medical advocates can respond to:

- Butler Memorial Hospital
- UMPC Passavant Cranberry
- Slippery Rock University Health Center
- Private healthcare facility

Civil Legal Representation

VOICe attorneys can represent survivors for the following cases:

- Protection orders
- Custody
- Divorce
- Immigration
- Landlord/tenant issues

Children's Services

VOICe can work with you and your children to stop the cycle of abuse and help develop your children's ability to heal. If child abuse has been reported, an advocate can be your point of contact and support throughout the process.
